



## **Post-doctoral Fellowship, University of Aberdeen**

Applications are invited for a three year full-time post-doctoral research position to work on a research project on the eyewitness identification ability of children and adolescents with a focus on video identity parades utilising the VIPER system. In addition to laboratory simulations of eyewitness memory, the project will involve an archival analysis of the outcomes of video identity parades involving child witnesses in Scotland.

The post is fully funded by the Scottish Institute for Policing Research and the University of Aberdeen. The post will be based in the School of Psychology at the University of Aberdeen in the north-east of Scotland. The start date is 1<sup>st</sup> of October 2007.

Applicants should have a PhD and a background in experimental or applied cognitive psychology and an excellent track record of research in the eyewitness or closely related area. Starting salary (pounds) £26,915.
